Memorial service Thursday, 1 September 2016 (which follows reports re. Archives, Tree of Life, Website)

Introduction: In this Memorial service of the quinquennium when we have celebrated '75 years of healing leaves', we come to give thanks for the women of our movement who have contributed so much to our aim 'to know Christ and to make him known' and have now gone through death to share in his resurrection life. 'The saying is sure: "if we have died with him, we will also live with him; if we endure, we will also reign with him."' (2 Timothy 2:11-12, NRSV)

Call to worship: 'Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love.' (Ephesians 1:3-4, NRSV)
