

Dear NZMWF Sisters

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ whose birth we celebrate and whose presence we proclaim as the divine son who came to our world as a human in order to reveal God's everlasting love to us.

In Advent, I am encouraged to think about the Christmas story in Luke 1: 39-45. The Bible says: 'A few days later Mary hurried to the hill country of Judea...She entered the house and greeted Elizabeth. At the sound of Mary's greeting, Elizabeth's child leaped within her, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. Elizabeth...exclaimed to Mary, "God has blessed you above all women, and your child is blessed..." Mary stayed with Elizabeth for about three months and then she went back to her own home" (Luke 1:39-42, 56).

May the spirit of Christmas continue to resonate in our lives, as Chosen Women Called to Proclaim Love and Hope for Women and Children. May the Prince of Peace and His Holy Spirit dwell in our hearts so that we could be a "spiritual friend" to others.
