75 years on since the signing of the Charter which brought our Federation into existence, we can remember and honour the work of women all over the world in bringing healing - physical, mental, emotional and spiritual - to the world's hurting people. So the theme to guide us through this celebratory year is "75 Years of Healing Leaves". The logo, from a sketch by Ann Connan and a refinement by Rodrigues, our TOL design artist, shows the continuing life and growth of the leaves from the tree of life, and reminds us of the work our Federation is committed to.

The Tree of Life





Within World Federation, there are m a n y programs, decisions and

activities; words and more words; large and small events; and people - World Officers, Executive members, Unit leaders and their members; but the ministry of "healing leaves" is often the quiet actions of individuals.

Long ago, our foremothers chose "the tree of life" as the emblem of the WFMW, and I am suggesting that amongst World Federation's members, there could be several different images of what really is the "World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women".

Is your image of WFM&UCW that of World Officers and Executive Committee members as the trunk and branches of that "tree of life"? Or do you imagine the "tree of life's" trunk, branches and leaves all bound up together as one of God's creations?

Perhaps you think that you are simply a disconnected twig on some enormous tree growing far, far away? However you imagine World Federation, its "tree of life" needs to be deeply rooted, sustained and nurtured in the soil of the Being of God, and be perpetually refreshed by the "water of life"!

There are several Biblical references to the "tree of life", which emphasise that without God's sustaining powers, and without being watered by God's truth, that tree is dead wood. "...blessed are those who trust in the Lord and have made the Lord their hope and confidence. They are like trees planted along a riverbank, with roots that reach deep into the water. Such trees are not bothered by the heat or worried by long months of drought. Their leaves stay green, and they go right on producing delicious fruit." (Jeremiah 17:7-8) 1

The preceding words to the World Federation's motto describe how the "tree of life" is refreshed and sustained by the water of life: "flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb..."

(Revelations 22:1b) 1 Through God's grace and mercy within a world-wide fellowship of women (and sometimes men), as "leaves" on God's "tree of life", it is essential that we remain rooted and grounded in God, and that we are perpetually refreshed by the Water of Life Jesus Christ - who said: "... the water I give them takes away thirst altogether. It becomes a perpetual spring within them, giving them eternal life." (John 4: 14) 1

Are you part of a living and continually refreshed "tree of life", or are you dead wood?

Jesus said 'a tree is known by its fruit'

It was 1939; a group of Methodist women had a dream, that there would be a worldwide organisation of Methodist women, with vision for living and working for wholeness in life. Their choice of emblem - the Tree of Life - in which its parts- trunk, branches, leaves, fruits represent the human family and its relationship with the world in which we live, is truly inspirational. The selection of the issues-encompassing Health, Education, Faith, the Economy, Peace touches the lives of us all, wherever and however we live. They encompass the teaching of Jesus, expressed in the language and culture of His day.

In choosing the tree as an emblem, they drew on both Genesis and Revelation. As we study the Word of God, we are invited to see our world, in its beauty and pain; the Bible uses illustrations of the trunk, branches, leaves and fruits, together with its gift of shelter. The life-force of the tree is in the sap contained in the trunk, which draws it from the earth, spreading it through the branches and leaves. The leaves provide shelter and also absorb, from the sun, life-giving strength. The woody stems and the leaves need each other; neither can live without the other.

The tree has lessons for all of us. As the tree needs all its parts to be truly healthy and able to serve the place where it grows, so we, God's people, need to draw on the strengths that are there for us, to serve the world in which we live.

We can link the life, strength and purpose of the tree to our world and its needs.

Families, communities, nations cannot fulfil their purpose unless they are healthy and at peace with one another. The tree is not whole unless all its parts

are whole.

We are the leaves which receive the life of the tree, offering shelter, purpose and beauty to the whole. The Holy Spirit offers us life, strength and wholeness to fulfil our purpose, to love, serve and care for each other in a demanding world.

May the God of Life live in each ONE

As the sap feeds the tree

May Christ, who saves, sustain each ONE

As the leaves preserve the tree

May the Holy Spirit who strengthens and sustains

Enable each to serve community and nation.

Church in Tonga in the South Pacific. Of how hope held our family together when I suffered from chronic depression for 10 years.

I have learnt that talking about my struggle with depression has helped my recovery and, I believe, helps other sufferers. I believe I now have an understanding of hell, because at times I felt I was there. And that was because I could not find God in the black hole I was in. I suffered periods of amnesia, anxiety attacks, lost my appetite, my confidence, my concentration. I had bouts in hospital and attempted suicide 5 times. I put my family through a terrible time.

But in all of that despair, God was there! God was there in my best friend, Fran. God was there in my "adopted" father, Hugh. God was there in my psychiatrist. God was there in my support group from the church. God was there in John. And in my good moments I knew it.

I now believe God was guiding my life through all of this to prepare me for this time. I have said before that God doesn't call the equipped, but equips those he calls. I think I'm who I am because God has "interfered" and the healing leaves of the Tree of Life have been wrapped around me.

I have been blessed with 4 wonderful children:

- Kirsten, Obstetrician / Gynaecologist.
- Hamish, Federal Policeman.
- Rowena, Special Education Teacher.
- Two grandsons and two granddaughters.

CONSTITUTION OF THE World Federation of Methodist Women

Article I ~ Name ~ This organization shall be known as the World Federation of Methodist

Article II ~Basis ~ The World Federation of Methodist Women is a fellowship of such organized groups as will accept Jesus Christ as the revelation of God and the Saviour of mankind and will affirm their purpose, "To know Christ and to make Him known."

<u>Article III ~Aim</u> ~ The World Federation of Methodist Women seeks to aid in establishing Christ's Kingdom among all peoples and in all areas of life; to share the abundant life of Christ with womanhood and childhood through evangelism, healing ministries, education and social services; to assist in promotion of the missionary spirit throughout our world parish; to seek with women of all lands fellowship and mutual help in the building of a Christian Order.

Article IV ~Membership ~ All national groups organised in accordance with Articles II and III are eligible for membership in the World Federation of Methodist Women. The Basis and Aim must be quoted in full in the Constitution of all national organizations.

Article V ~ International Council ~ There shall be a promotional and advisory body known as the International Council of the World Federation of Methodist Women. The membership of the Council shall consist of one official correspondent from each affiliated country on the basis of one member for each one hundred thousand or less members of the national organization. Each unit shall operate under its own constitution and by-laws. The Council shall act as a unifying and correlating agency for the exchange of plans, programs and policies and for the promotion of projects mutually accepted by the countries represented.

Article VI ~ Officers ~ There shall be a President, a First Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary elected by the Council. There shall also be an additional Vice President elected by each jurisdiction and Central Conference within the Methodist Church. Representation on a similar basis will be accorded national groups of women of other Methodist communions.

The above constitute the Executive Committee of the Council. The Executive committee and the Official Correspondents mentioned in Article V shall constitute the voting body of the quadrennial meetings.

Article VII ~ Meetings ~ The Council shall meet once in four years at the time and place of the General Conference of the Methodist Church.

Article VIII ~ Finance ~ The Council shall be maintained by special gifts, bequests, and devices and by voluntary contributions from each affiliated group.

Article IX ~ Change of Constitution ~ This Constitution may be amended at any quadrennial meeting of the voting body of the Council by a three-fourths vote of those present and voting. Notice of the proposed change having been given in writing one year in advance of the meeting.

October 26, 1939



Opportunities for Ministry.

The North America Area has been in existence in part almost since the founding of the Federation. It is made up of

10 regions; nine regions are found in the United States of America and the tenth one is the Caribbean and the Americas. In each of these regions we find African Methodist Episcopal Church Women (AME), African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church Women (AMEZ), Christian Methodist Episcopal Church Women (CME), Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas Women (MCCA) and United Methodist Women (UMW).

The United Methodist Women is the oldest group in this area having been in existence since 1869 followed by the AME Women's Missionary Society who were formed in 1874, the AMEZ Woman's Home and Overseas

Missionary Society in 1880 and the CME Women's Missionary Council which was founded in 1918. The MCCA is the newest unit of the North America Area having become an autonomous Conference in 1976 and having the desire to foster closer relationships between the membership of the Church. The dream came true in 1980 when the "MCCA Women" launched in a meeting in Barbados.

This fellowship of women from the different countries and cultures allows us the opportunity to share our faith, our stories and our love for God and mission and learn from each other. One of the things that we have in common is our need to be in ministry with women and children in a way to help others find their strengths and gifts that God has given them. We as part of the Federation are able to come closer to God through Bible Study and songs and learn about social issues that affect women and children so that we can be prepared to act and speak up on behalf of those who have no voice.

The First Methodist Missionaries landed on the shores of Galle on the Southerntip of Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) on the 29th of September, 1814 because

of the determination of Dr. Thomas Coke to work in India. In spite of the objections of the British Conference, Dr Coke's dream was realized through the first landing in Galle from where Methodism spread to India. Pakistan and Burma (now Myanmar). These four countries now form the South Asia Area of WFMUCW.

Women's work and Methodist Women's

Fellowships ran parallel to those of the early Missionaries and Schools, Orphanages and Churches were built and progressed rapidly all over South Asia, contributing to the uplifting and education of women.

My first encounter with WFMUCW was in 1993 at the South Asia Seminar held in Lahore ,Pakistan which I attended as a Delegate from Sri Lanka. Khushnud Azariah , was the President and I was deeply impressed by the work of the Federation, the Weaving Together Program and the fellowship between all of us.

As I was the Unit President of Sri Lanka, Shunila Ruth requested that I arrange the South Asia Seminar in Colombo. Dorothy Sampath Kumar was elected as Area President and I as Vice President for 2006-2011.
