# 4. Airport:

All arrivals by air will be at the Kotoka International Airport, Accra. Once you arrive at Accra and you are through with the immigration procedures and have collected your luggage, transport from the airport will be organized for you to Pentecost Covention Centre. Please look out for the placard with the inscription 'WFMUCW'. #### By Road:

Those travelling by road should find their way to the Wesley House, Methodist Church Ghana, Liberia Road, Accra, opposite Cedi House. Transport will be organized for you to the Pentecost Convention Centre.

#### 5. Accommodation:

Accommodation will be at the Pentecost Convention Centre in Accra, Ghana. The selected accommodation venue provides full board accommodation (breakfast, lunch and dinner). Please bring towels and toiletries. WFMUCW will not be responsible for any additional expenses that you will incur during the seminar. Such expenses include, but are not limited to: telephone calls, faxes, e-mail/internet, alcoholic beverages, laundry, newspapers, local transport, etc.

#### 6. Registration fees:

Please remember to bring your registration fee of 300 US Dollars. Please note that registration will be paid before allocation of rooms.

# 7. Refunds:

Please note that there will be no refund of local expenses, visa fees etc.

#### 8. Visa:

West Africa delegates will not need visa for entering into Ghana. All the others are required to apply for a visa in your home country before departure.

## 9. Required Inoculation:

- **Yellow Fever:** A yellow fever vaccination certificate is mandatory and entry to Ghana can be refused if you turn up without one.
- Please make sure you have your inoculation certificate.

## 10. Weather and Temperature:

The weather in Accra in September is warm and humid.

## 11. Currency Exchange Rates:

For all local transactions the currency used is the Ghana Cedi. The exchange rate changes. Currently it is approximately **US Dollars \$1: GHC4.5.** Money can be changed at the airport upon arrival at the forex bureaus. Provision will also be made for exchange of currency at the Pentecost Convention Centre, the venue of the Seminar.

### 13. Other Travel Tips

## 13.1. Local transport in Accra

WFMUCW will provide you with transport from the Airport to Pentecost Convention Centre, Accra on your arrival day and from Pentecost Convention Centre to the Airport on the day you depart. There will be an organized transport for sight-seeing and shopping. WFMUCW will not be responsible for any other travel cost/shopping expenses that you may incur outside the arranged transportation.

It is important to be security conscious. Take extra care of your handbags /bags and valuables all the time.

## 13.3. Plugs and Internet Access

Electricity in Ghana is 220/240 volts AC and 50 hertz. Plugs are UK type square three pin. Internet facility may not be available at the venue.

You can use your mobile phone to make calls by purchasing the local SIM Card and airtime. Networks available are MTN, Airtel, Vodafone, Tigo and Glo.

## 13.5. Shop

There is a shop nearby where you can purchase basic necessities. Enquire from reception.
