EDITORIAL

Three World Officers were able to attend the Latin America Area Seminar in Sao Paulo, Brazil in April 2019. After long journeys, we could have been forgiven for being tired, but the energy and passion of the women of this Area soon re-energised us. I am sure everyone felt uplifted by the fellowship, worship and sharing of news that we experienced here as women 'Called to proclaim the greatness of God'.

Our venue was the Faculty of Theology, within the impressive Methodist University of Sao Paulo, Sao Bernado Campus. It felt very significant that this centre of learning was named after Mrs Otilia Chaves, Brazilian World President of the World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women 1952-56. Our hosts, the women of Brazil, led by Area President Leila Barbosa and supported by Vice-President Jessica Solar, made us so very welcome and showed us generous hospitality. Keila Guimaraes and Andrea Reilly provided much-needed translation. University students also provided support, and Rev Margarida Ribeiro, Principal of the Theology Faculty, led us in two beautiful services of Holy Communion in the closing worship for both the Weaving Together Program and the Seminar.

Three younger women addressed us during the seminar: Karen Danna and Luiza Pereira, both Helen Kim Memorial Scholars and Ester Antunes, a Global Mission Fellow. Each one is already showing great leadership potential and will have been greatly encouraged by the positive response they received here. Rev Andreia Fernandes Oliveira's bible study session deepened my understanding of the story of Dorcas in Acts 9. Later, I was affected emotionally by the accounts of oppression and violence against women in Latin America and the way women are speaking out against injustice, even at risk to themselves.

I for one, returned home with the impression that the Methodist women of Latin America are committed, courageous and faithful to the call of Jesus Christ to proclaim the greatness of God. I shall pray that their significant contribution to the life of the church is soon fully acknowledged and valued by all. I shall always be grateful for this opportunity to spend time with my sisters of the Latin America Area.

After the Closing Ceremony of the WTP in the Umesp Chapel, the expectation was on the rise for all to begin the Training Seminar, with all the participants. Mainly for us, those of CMMALC, who received everyone with the hope that everything would be a blessing for the sisters, source of learning, of joy, of communion!

The program began with lunch and at 2pm, the Opening Service.

OPENING SERVICE

There were 13 from Latin America and the Caribbean, 01 from England, from our World President Alison Judd and 02 from New Zealand, the original country of Mataiva Robertson and Leu Pupulu, Secretary and Treasurer, respectively.







The Service was directed by our President Leila de Jesus Barbosa, who greeted everyone with great affection. We count with Eloisa ALtino in praise, President of the 4th Region of Brazil, who

accepted our invitation for the moments of praise. A joy, a beautiful voice that God has given! Also in the Prelude, the beautiful voice of Leda Leziria of the 1st Region.

And in the Opening Service, the preaching was by Reverenda Joana D'arc Meireles, Secretary for Life and Mission of the Methodist Church of Brazil.

A blessed word, based on the biblical text of the Gospel of Luke, chapter 7, verses 36 to 50. The sinful woman who anointed the feet of Jesus with a precious balm very expensive, and with his hair dried the feet of Jesus. That woman, before entering the room where Jesus was, probably stood at the door, indecisive, insecure ...



How many times we stayed at the door, without courage, with doubts, hesitating? Should we enter or not? I do or do not do? That woman has overcome the barriers, entered and found freedom, peace, at the feet of Jesus.

That woman is not mentioned her name, she remained anonymous, so that each one of us could put our name. I am that woman who stands at the door and let postrate at the feet of the Lord!

What word! What a wonderful word!

CONFERENCE AND GROUPS

On this first day of the seminar, on April 12, we had the privilege of listening to two very special Pastors. Reverend Andreia Fernandes and Reverend Andrea Reily!

In the first place, we heard and participated with Reverend Andreia Fernandes, National Coordinator of the Department of the Sunday School of the Methodist Church in Brazil, a motivating Conference that called us to a great reflection, starting from the biblical text that tells about Dorcas (Acts 9.36 -43). The participants divided into groups, reflected on several questions, one of them: who are we? And, we came to the conclusion that we need to think about ourselves, have a time for ourselves, learn to say NO. Know our limits, objectives and needs! We have been chosen to proclaim life, the greatness of God, but we need to be well!



After that enlightening and motivating word, with a break for dinner, it was the turn of staying in a great round of conversation, right there in the dining room, a place of communion, where we first enjoyed a delicious meal!

We separated the chairs, we stayed on one side and the Reverend Andrea Reily, Regional Missionary of the United Methodist Women for the development of Leadership in Latin America, started a very enlightening talk about the situation of women.

This time began with the reading of the biblical text in Numbers 37.1-11, which was read by two sisters, one in Portuguese and one in Spanish.

Who did this text talk about? Ah!, the daughters of Zelophehad. Have you heard about them?

Their father died and he had no children, only these 5 daughters. Because they were women, they had no right to inheritance. So, they let that inheritance pass ... Was that so? NO!

They did not accept that, they took courage and went to look for Moses. There was nothing to lose. They were not afraid to make that inquiry. Moses heard their argument and went to consult God. And God accepted. They were right. God changed the Law, so that they too would receive the inheritance. A change was necessary.

Women, we have to know the laws, be empowered, have knowledge, arguments, union of thoughts to reach the authorities.

And, with this reflection, Reverend Andrea launched the following question: What is it like to be a woman in your country? What are the challenges in your country?

And several sisters, stood up, one at a time, and were telling a little of their realities ... There was a lot of emotion ... tears ... how much pain! Injustices, lack of love, judgments, violence ... Realities of suffering, of pain, of oppression, of machismo. Different lands, but we could see that being a woman, anywhere, is being a warrior, a brave woman, a fighter! How much content on this first day of Seminar! It was intense, rich in teachings, exchange of experiences, motivating!



THURSDAYS IN BLACK

Of course, in this Seminar, on the 11th, on a Thursday, we could not stop being in Campaign!

All day, all the participants, we use black! Not violence against women!

All united, with their pins and T-shirts, walking through the Methodist University, in a silent protest!

There were also moments for photos, with a banner!



CONFERENCE OF PRESIDENT ALISON JUDD

We started on the 13th, waiting for the arrival of the sisters who were going to participate only on this day, since the Seminary would be open for all those who wanted to participate.

Eloisa summoned the women to praise and "go down to the pottery room". Starting the day with that cheerful praise, where everyone had to "move"! Bolivia, Colombia, Argentina, everything! Until England and New Zealand, they had to "go to God's pottery room".

Oh my God! What women of God, happy, praising with joy! Sensational!

Praise is a way of proclaiming!

Yes, it was one of the things we learned from the Alison Judd Conference, which was immediately after the praise.

"Calls to proclaim through adoration and relationships".

At the beginning of the Conference, President Alison mentioned the biblical text in 1 Peter 2.9, which is the theme verse, to be worked in these 5 years by the World Federation.

We are called to proclaim! And we can do it in several ways: through actions and relationships.

May we be inspired and recognize that we are chosen to proclaim!

Praise! Hymns are an expression of our faith, and we can proclaim the greatness of God through praise!

Think about your favorite Hymn! Does it tell the story of Jesus and talk about salvation?

Proclaim through experiences, prayer, meetings in the Service. It is very important to have a call to prayer!

In Bulgaria, the Government was creating a new law and the Church could not stay in the country. The sisters united in prayer for this cause. The Government has already decided not to create this new law. Glory to the Lord!

PRAY! In the church, in hospitals and clinics, in houses. Go out on Saturdays to pray. Prayer is part of the spiritual life! There are many ways to proclaim the faith! For what we use, for the banners, for the pamphlets and even for the social networks themselves.

Through relationships, we teach our children, grandchildren, family.

We are chosen people to proclaim the truth, the love of God and give glory to God!

Ah!, how was this word uplifting! Simple actions, which can make a difference!

THE YOUNG MISSIONARY ESTER

Ester Antunes! It is the name of that young Brazilian missionary, who is participating in the Global Mission Fellows! Today she is working in Uruguay.

We hear with attention about the Program, how it works and about her experiences in this mission.

The challenges are many, check the need of localities, AIDS, Human Rights, work of young people.

How much experience this young woman already has. She has gone through tense moments, of fear, she has witnessed hunger, pain, deaths, but she also obtains her gratitude for all the help she can provide to the little ones, to those they need.

She left us excited, and touched our hearts with her willingness to work, to help, to be in the mission, with all the difficulties and desires.



And she left us the following verse: "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." (1 Corinthians 15:58)

We emphasize that in our Seminar, it was exciting and rewarding to meet these three young women, committed to the mission: Ester, Luiza and Karen!

It was good to listen, to know the work of these young people, to know that they are on this path! It was very motivating to hear them!
